FYI: We have had FoCH Board members in Vietnam inspecting the established projects, determining what needs to be taken forward and or redirected. Just remember, these trips are paid for by the individual Board Member, as they have always been, in keeping with the philosophy of FoCH on spending almost every last nickel on the needs of the people we serve.

Some of the activities we have been involved with in 2010 were:

- * The construction of a Boy's Dorm at the Jackfruit orphanage location;
- * Salary for nurse Lan,

- * Purchase of pharmaceuticals as needed,
- * The completion of plans and securing funding to rebuild the doors and windows of the Dak Kia leprosy village which were destroyed in the 2009 flood,
- * Securing funding and completion of planning to provide a dental plan for the children of Dak Kia leprosy village this summer after the end of the school year,
- * We purchased additional bedding and sanitary products for the disabled children's orphanage,
- * We were able to expand the remote village education Project. It now includes students at the primary, secondary and college level: A total of 36 children in 11 remote villages. This is an intensely reviewed Project to assure compliance with attendance and grade requirements,

* We also have continued our “Quality of Life Projects”, such as Christmas parties, Tet New Year celebrations and the Fall Festivals. This year we provided these celebrations for well over 400 children, and the cost has been directed spending that we have received as donations.
